- (i) weft knitting [2]
  - (ii) warp knitting [2]
- (b) Explain briefly the production methods used for weft knitting. [4]
- (c) Compare the performance characteristics of warp and weft knitted fabrics in terms of:
- stretch characteristics
  - yarn suitability. [8]
- (d) Discuss why warp knitted fabrics rather than woven fabrics might be used for uniforms and workwear. Include specific examples of warp knitted fabrics in your answer. [9]

- (a) (i) Identify **three** regenerated cellulose fibres. [3]
- (ii) Describe the source of **each** of the fibres identified in (a)(i). [3]

- (b) Compare **four** performance characteristics of polyester fibres with the characteristics of regenerated cellulose fibres. [8]
- (c) Discuss the possible end uses of woven polyester fabrics. [8]



- (c) Explain how the shape of ladies' skirts has evolved, giving examples from the designers you have studied. You may include sketches in your answer. [6]
- (d) Discuss how the style of ladies' skirts has been influenced by new developments of fibres and fabrics over the years. [9]

- traditional hand methods
  - using computer aided design [8]
