- 1** Comment on points of interest or difficulty in **four** of the following passages (wherever possible answers should refer to the context of the passage but should not retell the story from which the passage is taken):
- (a) Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.
(Matthew 4:1)
- (b) So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves."
(Matthew 27:24)
- (c) And she came in immediately with haste to the king, and asked, saying, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter."
(Mark 6:25)
- (d) And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to any one, for they were afraid.
(Mark 16:8)
- (e) "... for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed."
(Luke 1:48)
- (f) The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!"
(Luke 10:17)
- (g) And I will pray the Father, and he will give you another Counsellor, to be with you for ever.
(John 14:16)
- (h) They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. (John 20:4)

- 6 Discuss the distinctive features of the parables of Jesus in Luke's gospel.
- 7 Why did Luke write his gospel?
- 8 Explain the 'I am' sayings in John's gospel.
- 9 Discuss and explain the features of John's presentation of the Passion of Jesus that are **not** found in the synoptic gospels.
- 10 Assess the significance of the gospel narratives of the baptism and transfiguration of Jesus.
- 11 Explain why Jesus came into conflict with the Pharisees.
- 12 'Jesus urged his followers to give up all their possessions.' Discuss.
- 13 Consider the role played by women in the gospels.
- 14 'The gospels are theology, not history.' Explain and discuss this statement.
